Qualifying Beneficiary Organisation: St Monica's Children's Home

1. Methodology

Mr Peter J Cottrell, Treasurer to St Monica's Children's Home and a Chartered Accountant by profession compiled information in support of the measurement criteria, in 2. Below.

These criteria are based on the measurement principles as contained in Statement 700, of Code Series 700, of the Dti Broad-based BEE Codes of Good Practice, gazetted 09 February 2007.

2. Measurement Criteria

The following was measured:

- i) the nature of the organisation's activities;
- ii) the end-beneficiaries of its work, ie, the people who are it's target population group/s, and that directly benefit from it's activities;
- iii) the percentage of these end-beneficiaries who are broadly defined as 'Black'.

3. Evaluation and outcome

- i) Organisation's activities

The information supplied of St Monica's Children's Home has established that the organization meets with the requirements as a "beneficiary organization".

St Monica's Children's Home provides residential care to 84 Children who have been orphaned, abandoned or found to be at risk in their home environments.

Their purpose is to provide a safe environment for children placed in their institution through residential care and developmental programmes with the goal of eventual reunification to their families and/or communities

Such activities fall within the scope of the definition in the Dti's B-BBEE Codes for a qualifying socio-economic development programme. Further, these activities facilitate the sustainable access of the end-beneficiaries, as described in iii) below, to the economy of the country.

ii) Community served and end-beneficiaries

The Home is based on the Bluff, Durban, and primarily serves areas throughout KZNN and are accommodated from the ages of 3 to 18 years old from all race groups and religious backgrounds in South Africa.

iv) Percentage of end-beneficiaries broadly defined as 'Black' South African Citizens


The population group profile of the Home at the date of measurement was:

	Percentage
Black Children	98%
White/Non-RSA	02%

Based on this profile, the target of 75% of end-beneficiaries being broadly defined Black South African citizens (African, Indian, Coloured, Chinese South Africans by birth or descent) has been exceeded.

As such, **100%** of the value any qualifying contributions made to St Monica's Children's Home is recognizable in terms of the B-BBEE Codes.
